
#### The Annual Inter-Faith Peace Service

Thank you so much for inviting me to speak to you here this evening. I am delighted to be here to help promote peace, a topic that is very close to my heart.

Leeds Concord Interfaith Fellowship was in 1976 one of the first interfaith groups to be established in Britain. This Peace Service has been its main annual event almost from the beginning. We are thrilled to host it in the Civic Hall.

Leeds has a long history of peace-making, peace people and peace action, with buildings, organisations and individuals associated with peace through the ages. Many of you will have seen the Leeds Peace Trail map and leaflet, researched and designed by members of Together for Peace and the Peace Museum, with support from Leeds City Council.

I am proud to be one of 5,000 Mayors for Peace throughout the world.

Tonight's Peace Service is supported by Leeds City Council Peacelink Group. This organises other peace events, like the Olaf Palme peace lecture with Leeds Beckett University, and the commemoration of Hiroshima-Nagasaki in August I was honoured to attend.

I have also visited Garforth and saw the World Peace Flame Garden there. I was very impressed indeed by the work of the group who tend the flame and work with schools and the community to promote peace and international understanding.

In Leeds, we are fortunate to have many beautiful churches, chapels, meeting halls, mosques, synagogues, gurdwaras and mandirs. Concord organises a Walk of Friendship visiting places of worship, enabling people to learn about similarities as well as differences and to establish friendships among different faiths.

Leeds is proud to be a diverse multi-ethnic, multicultural city. Meeting, talking, cooperating with each other breaks down barriers and removes misunderstandings, strengthening community. Leeds is a City of Sanctuary, welcoming asylum seekers and refugees fleeing from conflict and oppression. In September, I visited Ukraine (in a personal capacity) to further the twinning between Leeds and Kharkiv. I saw and heard for myself the terrible toll that the war has taken on the country and its people, and am glad that we in Leeds have been able to offer sanctuary to some of its citizens.

We all need peace, for our countries and our own wellbeing. My charity, Leeds Women's Counselling, works with women and girls to overcome trauma that disrupts their peace of mind, and brings light out of darkness.

I am delighted to see representatives from Leeds' different religions in the city lighting candles for peace. All the candles will be lit from the World Peace Flame.

#### World Peace Flame

Thank you Lord Mayor and thank you Concord for once again organising this very special service for peace for the benefit of us all.

We would like to extend a very special thank you to our Lord Mayor who is very supportive of the possibility of a Central Leeds WPF Monument.

We are as delighted as ever to be here with the WPF and as most of you know our city is home to England's first WPF Monument in Garforth. Its simple message "one flame uniting people worldwide in peace" gives hope to all.

We have enjoyed another busy year with our schools and community sharing the message of peace and embarking on a new, special school project, the Coronation Peace Tree Project. This has seen our six schools all plant a native Coronation Peace Tree along with commemorative plague to honour our Monarch King Charles III, within their school grounds. Our schools are also underway with an indoor eco-Coronation Peace Tree. The children have created leaves of peace, all with individual statements ranging from welcoming our new King to peace, harmony, kindness and so much more.

Our children who are here this evening, from Strawberry Fields Primary School, have completed and have on display their wonderful eco-peace tree as a focus for peace and harmony in their lovely school and we are thrilled to have them

here tonight. We believe they will inspire you.

Our children have also undertaken to plant sustainable trees as part of the project. We continue to be inspired and uplifted by our young peacemakers of the future as we interact with them on various projects based around peace. They have now, collectively, created the Garforth Schools' World Peace Trail, the Garforth Schools' Peace Flag and are now focusing on indoor eco-Coronation Peace Trees. In July they were part of the first Peace Cake Bake off and raised money for three charities as well as creating beautiful delicious cakes and buns with a theme of peace.

Shortly we will have the pleasure of preparing for the 6th Annual Peace Lantern Walk, in Remembrance Week, where our children and community will honour the peace that was created, whilst still honouring this special time, by making their own peace lanterns and walking the peace trail, this is on Friday 10th November at 6.30 p.m.

We are truly honoured to continue with the message of peace through this simple special flame and in particular with our children who are indeed our future peacemakers and I am inspired each day by each and every one of them to know our future is in very good hands, thank you children and thank you to everyone here for all that you do for peace.

### 6. Presentation by Strawberry Fields Primary School, Garforth.

Ladies and gentlemen, and friends of all ages, thank you for inviting us to speak at the Concord Peace Event. We are a group of children from Strawberry Fields Primary School, in Garforth.

We want to talk to you about something really important to us: PEACE. Peace is like a big puzzle, and every one of us holds a piece to make our community, our world, a better place. Today, we'll tell you

about peace right here in our community as well as peace in the wider world. We will also tell you how peace connects to the plight of refugees, something which has, in recent years, been close to our heart in Garforth.

So, let's start with peace in our local community. When we think about peace here, it's like a garden of kindness. It means being nice to our neighbours, classmates, and even the people we meet every day. It's about sharing, helping, and making sure everyone feels safe and happy. When we have peace in our community, we can play in the park, walk to school, and make friends without being scared or worried. It's like having a big, friendly family right where we live.

In our community, in Garforth, we have something very special which helps us to spread peace and hope among our community; the Garforth World Peace Flame. With Sue and Fi's help, we have a

focus for joining together in peace. At Strawberry Fields, we have been lucky to be involved in many of the projects led by Sue and Fi who inspire us with Gandhi's message 'Be the change you want to see in the world.' We want to live in a world where peace, hope, joy and love exists and, through the peace flame, we work hard to achieve this.

Together with the schools across Garforth, we have enjoyed a number of peace flame projects.

Each year, we are invited to take part in the annual peace flame lantern walk, joining with members of the local community to walk to our peace flame housed in the

Jubilee Garden in Garforth.

We have painted peace stones, which can be seen at various stations along the Garforth peace trail. We are lucky enough to have one such station positioned at the front of Strawberry

Fields Primary School.

We have baked cakes for the Peace Flame Bake Off, held in our local hall.

Sue and Fi also invited us to enter the 'Peace Flag' competition, designing a flag to represent our school on a community peace flag. The flags were displayed in our local village hall, during a community event, and members of our local community were invited to vote for their winner from each school. The chosen flags from each school were combined to create a community peace flag

In a recent 'Coronation Peace Tree' project, we produced leaves with what peace means to us written on them. We gathered with children from the other schools in Garforth and exchanged our leaves, which were taken back to each school and placed on a peace tree display. Alongside the display of Coronation Peace Tree leaves, we were gifted a tree, planted within our grounds, by the Garforth World Peace Flame. We were delighted that the Lord Mayor of Leeds joined us for a tree dedication where all in our school community gathered and shared reflections on peace.

You will have heard us use the word 'community' a lot. Community is important to us as a school, and building peace in our community is something we strive for. But peace isn't just about our neighbourhood. It's also about the whole wide world. Imagine our world as a giant playground with lots of countries. Sometimes these countries don't get along, and they argue or fight. That's not good. Peace in the wider world means countries talking instead of fighting, helping each other out, and being friends. It's like when we solve problems with our friends by talking and understanding each other, but on a much bigger scale.

Sometimes, in some countries, there are really big problems, like wars and natural disasters. People living there have to leave their homes because it is no longer safe for them to live there. These refugees are scared, worried and helpless. They don't have a place to stay, and they need help from other countries to be safe and start a new life.

This is where we come in. Our local community can be like a warm, welcoming hug for refugees. When our community is peaceful and caring, we can open our hearts

and help refugees who come here. We can share our homes, our food, and our friendship. We can help them feel safe and show them that there's hope, even in tough times. Out of the darkness we can bring light. In recent years, Garforth has become that warm, welcoming hug to refugees who were homed in our local community. Our peace flame in Garforth has shone brighter than ever as a beacon of love, peace and hope. As a school, we welcomed many Afghan refugee families who came to live, learn, smile and play alongside us, and it was the most wonderful experience which allowed us to open our community to others as a shelter of peace and harmony.

Imagine if we all helped refugees, and if all countries talked instead of fighting. What would our world look like? It would be a world full of smiles, laughter, and love. It would be a world where everyone, no matter where they come from, can live in safety.

So, let's remember that peace isn't just a word. It's something we can make happen, right here in our community and across the world. We can be the peace-makers by being kind to our neighbours, in our local community and by helping refugees, from our global community, standing up for what is right and what is just.

In our hands, we hold the pieces of the peace puzzle. Let's put them together and create a world that's full of love, understanding, and hope. Together, we can make our world a better, more peaceful place for everyone. This is what we strive for at Strawberry Fields, with the peace flame providing that beacon of light and hope.
